The Right Shoes

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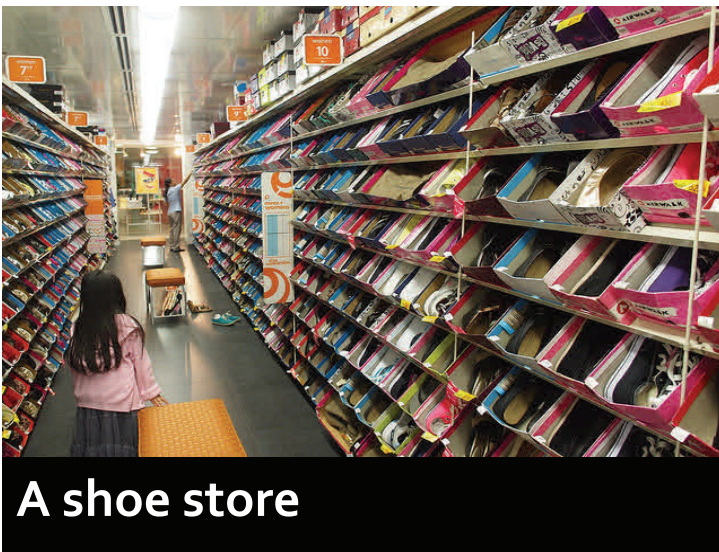

Glossary

cheaper	the price is lower than the other prices
cost	the amount of money you have to pay for something
discount	money that is subtracted from the regular price; sometimes it is a percentage %
regular price	the first price that is on the price tag for an item you want to buy – it is the highest price on the price tag
on sale	A price that is less than the regular price

Building Financial Knowledge

A wise consumer determines the need and budget for a purchase. As an informed shopper, the consumer knows that products have a regular price and often go on sale at a discount. Knowing how a sale price is calculated helps the shopper to make good decisions when shopping.
